Presidential Message

Dear ICSA community,

I hope this message finds you well and enjoying the summer break. On May 5th this year, The World Health Organization officially declared "with great hope" an end to Covid-19 as a global public health emergency after the pandemic claimed nearly 7 million lives and infected more than 765 million people worldwide. What a great relief to be able to move beyond the extremely stressful period in our lives in the past three years.

It is fitting that ICSA's conference theme this year is "Rebuilding the Post-pandemic World: Opportunities and Challenges". We are thrilled to return to an in-person format for this year's pre-ASA conference to be held in Philadelphia on August 17-18th 2023. This year's meeting will be hosted by the University of Pennsylvania (UPenn) with Professor Emily Hannum as the Co-Chair of the conference program committee with me. With support from UPenn, ICSA and UPenn have organized a special joint Forum with the Association of Korean Sociologists in America, and the Japan Sociologists Network at the beginning of the conference featuring Professors Emily Hannum, Hyunjoon Park, and James Raymo to discuss research on Inequality in East Asia and a joint reception at the end of the first day. Following this joint forum, ICSA will have a keynote speech delivered by Professor Lingxin Hao on COVID-19 Pandemic and Natural Disasters Compounded: How Do Asian Americans Fare? We will then have about 60 presentations on various themes over one and a half days. The program will be available online soon. I hope to see as many of you participate in this event as possible.

It has been more than six months since the new <u>ICSA Board of Directors</u> was elected in December 2022. Since then, the current board members have been working hard on the upcoming conference in August and other administrative tasks for the transition. Meeting minutes can be found on the ICSA website. Thanks to the previous Board, particularly Professor Xiaogang Wu, for its hard work and vision that set a solid foundation for ICSA's future development. Consistent with the vision of the previous Board to expand and internationalize the association, our membership has increased significantly and is notably internationalized. We now have 166 active members, 60% of whom are located in Asia. The previous Board also raised funds for a new Yu Xie Early Career Award which will be utilized to recognize and honor a member who has made significant contributions to our discipline in the early stage of their careers every year. We will continue to have the Nan Lin Best Student Paper competition every year. The winners of these awards will be announced and honored at the ICSA annual meeting. meeting one day before the ASA meeting and host other meetings in other locations during the year provided suitable hosts are available to co-organize such conferences with the ICSA.

The previous Board proposed to move the ICSA's business location to Hong Kong based on the growing number of members in Asia and the fact that Hong Kong is an international financial and cultural center. The current Board has discussed the pros and cons of this proposal and consulted more widely with some members in the past few months. (See discussions in the meeting minutes on the ICSA website.) We recognize this proposal has long-lasting implications for the association, hence more careful considerations are needed before a final decision. The Board will continue to seek input from the members about the process of deliberating this proposal and keep all members informed of our progress.

I would like to thank the board members for their hard work and all members for their continuous support of ICSA. Special gratitude goes to Yizhou Ye for providing invaluable administrative assistance and to Jun Xu and Jiao Guo for their expertise in editing the Newsletters for ICSA. I look forward to seeing many of you in person in Philadelphia in August.

The International Chinese Sociological Association (ICSA) is pleased to announce to hold its 6th Annual Conference in **Philadelphia**, **USA**. from **August 17 to 18, 2023 (Eastern Standard Time)**. The conference will be co-organized by **the ICSA** and **Center for the Study of Contemporary China at the University of Pennsylvania**.

Call for Papers

The conference's theme is "Rebuilding the Post-pandemic World: Opportunities and Challenges". The conference will be held in a face-to-face format.

The ICSA program committee welcomes submissions on topics related to this main theme, as well as on other topics, both theoretical work and empirical analysis. Papers offering comparative perspectives and cross-disciplinary approaches are particularly welcome. Both complete papers and extended paper abstracts in English will be considered. Extended abstracts must contain sufficient details to suggest timely completion (normally, 5 pages or more). Please provide all authors' names, organizational affiliations, and email addresses.

Graduate students are invited to compete for the ICSA 2023 Nan Lin Graduate Student Paper Award. One paper (published or unpublished) will be selected and the award will be announced in the conference and presented with a plaque and a check of USD 500 (by mail).







